10:15 am – 5:00 pm	<b>Activity: Squam Lakes Natural Science Center</b> <a href="https://www.nhnature.org/">https://www.nhnature.org/</a>  <b>Bring a picnic lunch to eat.</b>  <u>Live Animal Exhibit Trail</u> - Observe live, native New Hampshire wildlife — black bears, bobcats, mountain lions, river otters, red foxes, bald eagles, hawks, owls, and more — housed in woodland enclosures as you walk along our ¾-mile self-guided exhibit trail. The trail winds through forest and field, and past streams and ponds.  <u>Discover Lake Cruise from 2:30 – 4:00 pm</u> - Enjoy a Science Center Lake Cruise to experience the beauty of Big Squam Lake and learn about the natural forces that created this lake, the wildlife that makes it so special, and the people who have enjoyed it for over 5,000 years. Binoculars are available for wildlife viewing.

9:00 am – 2:00 pm	<p><b>Activity #1: Scenic Drive to four White Mountain National Forest Sites.</b> This scenic drive will provide some good photo opportunities.</p> <p>Four of these sites will require a fee for the National Forest Day Pass. If you have a National Park Interagency, Golden Age, Golden Access, or a previously purchased 1-7 consecutive days pass, you will need to bring it and display it on the vehicle dash. If you do not have a National Park pass, you will need to bring \$5.00 cash and a pen to fill out the day pass. We will organize our car pool to get the maximum benefit from the folks who have National Park passes.</p> <p><b>Bring a picnic lunch to eat at the Lower Falls.</b></p> <p><b>Stop #1: View of Mount Chocorua</b>  <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Mount_Chocorua">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Mount_Chocorua</a> Mount Chocorua is a summit in the White Mountains of NH.</p> <p><b>Stop #2: Sabbaday Falls</b>  <a href="https://kancamagushighway.com/sabbaday-falls-kancamagus-waterfalls-nh/">https://kancamagushighway.com/sabbaday-falls-kancamagus-waterfalls-nh/</a>  Sabbaday Falls is accessed via an easy 15-minute walk. The falls are a picturesque series of cascades in a narrow flume. If you need the day pass, you'll purchase it here.</p> <p><b>Stop #3: Rocky Gorge</b>  <a href="https://kancamagushighway.com/rocky-gorge-kancamagus-scenic-waterfalls/">https://kancamagushighway.com/rocky-gorge-kancamagus-scenic-waterfalls/</a>  Rocky Gorge is a powerful narrow gorge where water is almost always rushing through, even during droughts. Carved by glaciers, Rocky Gorge offers a 10' drop and rapids through the gorge.</p> <p><b>Stop #4: Lower Falls</b>  <a href="https://kancamagushighway.com/lower-falls-kancamagus-waterfalls-and-swimming-holes/">https://kancamagushighway.com/lower-falls-kancamagus-waterfalls-and-swimming-holes/</a>  Lower Falls is the most popular destination on the Kancamagus Highway. It is a beautiful spot where the Swift River drops many feet over smooth granite rocks into a large pool.
