The 2017 rate is \$48.00 per night for waterfront and \$42.00 per night for non-waterfront. The sites include water, electric, sewer and cable hookups. The campground has blocked out 13 sites in Area 3 for our group. Nine sites are waterfront and four are non-waterfront. Some members of the group will arrive on Thursday and stay until Monday. If you wish to extend your fun, you are welcome to join us.

Make your reservation by calling Terrace Pines directly. **The deadline is March 31, 2018.** Be sure to tell them you are with the Trailblazers rally hosted by Rick Newcomb. Because these are prime sites for the campground, we have a deadline that is earlier than normal.

For those who arrive early on Thursday, you may join us for dinner at a local restaurant. We will also have an optional bike ride on the Cotton Valley Rail Trail in Wolfeboro on Friday morning. This is a hard packed gravel rail trail. Rick will find an optional easy hike for Saturday morning.

The bike ride and hike will give you two opportunities to burn a few calories in preparation for our traditional potluck dinner scheduled for Saturday evening at 5:30 pm.

**Important Driving Directions and Info:** If you are using a GPS, after Ossipee Center when you turn from Moultonville Road to Valley Road, your GPS may say "in 2.x miles navigate off road." This is OK, the "off road" is the campground road. Also, Valley Road changes from a paved to a dirt road after approx. 1.5 miles.

At the campground entrance, there are two roads. You will want to turn on the road to the left. You will see a Tennis/Basketball court on the left road. The office is a short distance on your right. Your GPS may try to send you up the road to right but do NOT follow the GPS directions. The road to the right is a DEAD END.
